



THE LAST POST FUND COMMEMORATIVE CEREMONIES

**On the St. Lawrence River
Old Port of Montreal, Quai de l'Horloge
Friday 19 June 2009, from 10:00 to 11:30 a.m.**

After the Guard of Honour's salute to the Guest of Honour, Commodore Jennifer Bennet, Commander Naval Reserve, the boat sails to the St. Mary's current facing the Clock Tower for the start of the ceremony. On board, a volley will be fired by the Guard of Honour in memory of deceased Canadian and Allied Navy Veterans. A bugler and a piper will then play funerary pieces. The Guest of Honour will launch a floral tribute in the St. Lawrence River and a dove of peace will be released by the Silver Cross mother.

**In the Notre-Dame-des-Neiges and Mount-Royal Cemeteries
Sunday 21 June 2009, from 11:00 a.m. to noon**

After raising the Canadian flag and bringing it at half-mast, participants and the Colour Party of the Royal Canadian Legion are brought to attention. Prayers, musical airs by a bugler and a piper, a moment of silence in memory of deceased veterans, a poem by L. Binyon are all part of the ceremony. It will be followed by the laying of wreaths at the base of the Cross of Sacrifice and the unveiling of commemorative monuments in cooperation with Veterans Affairs Canada.

Sunday 21 June 2009, from 3:00 to 4:30 p.m.**

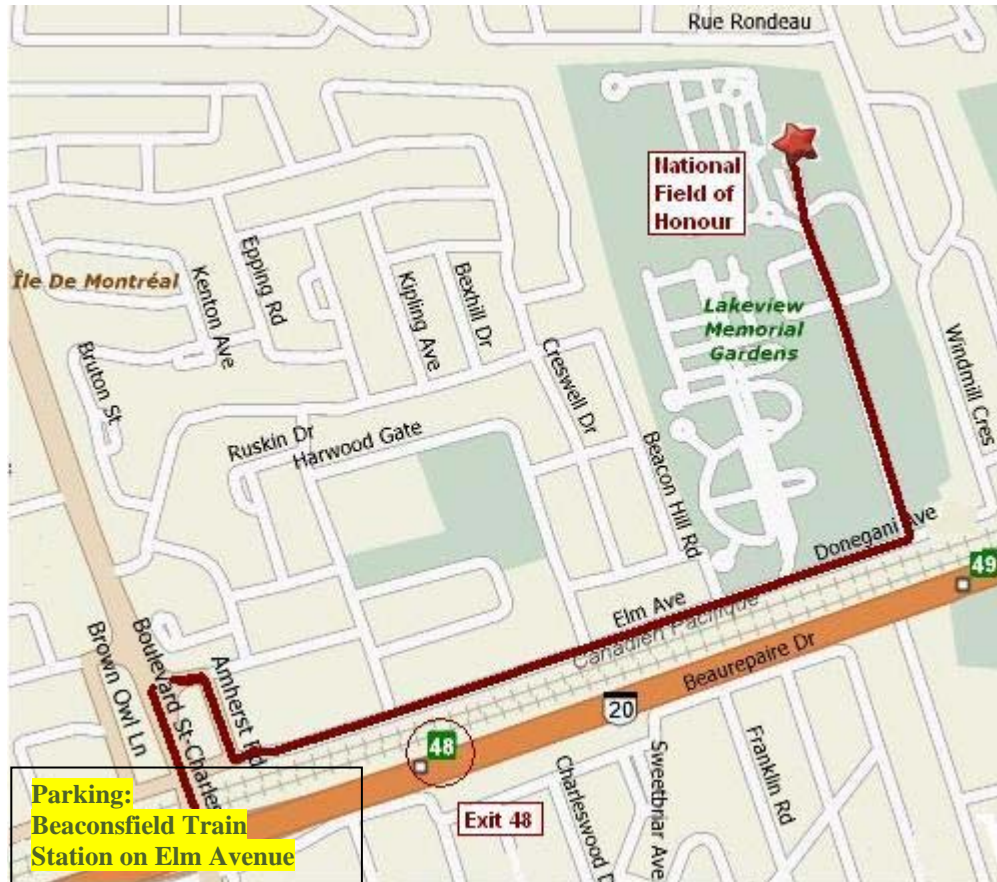
Guest of Honour is the Honourable Pierre Claude Nolin, Senator. He is welcomed by the Band, the Guard of Honour and the Legion Colour Parties. After the national anthem, Senator Nolin addresses the assembly of veterans and guests. Prayers, funerary airs played by the bugler and the piper, a moment of silence and reading of a poem by L. Binyon are all part of this commemorative ceremony.

Following the reading of a National Field of Honour historical summary, the cemetery is designated as a National Historic Site by the Historic Sites and Monuments Board of Canada and a commemorative plaque is unveiled. The piper followed by the Legion Colour Parties parade through the cemetery. Several wreaths are then deposited in memory of deceased veterans. At the end of the ceremony, Senator Nolin meets the Silver Cross Mother as well as veterans from the Ste. Anne de Bellevue Hospital.

DIRECTIONS TO THE NATIONAL FIELD OF HONOUR

The Last Post Fund National Field of Honour is located behind the Lakeview Memorial Gardens Cemetery (701 Donegani Avenue in Pointe-Claire, Québec).

On June 21st, visitors are asked to leave their car at the nearby Beaconsfield train station on Elm Avenue. A shuttle bus will then take them to the cemetery.



Directions from Montreal

1. Take Highway 20 West (from Montreal)
2. Take the St-Charles Blvd Exit (Exit 48)
3. Turn right onto St. Charles Boulevard
4. Turn right onto Amherst Road
5. Turn right onto Elm Avenue
6. Parking at nearby Beaconsfield train station
7. Shuttle bus service to the cemetery.
