IRONMAN RUNS TO BENEFIT THE LAST POST FUND

Ironman Colin Hackett, a 29-year old high school teacher from Edmonton, swims, bikes and runs in order to collect money for Canada's Veterans.



Colin's grandfather who recently passed away served in WWII as a rear-gunner in a Halifax bomber. His father is a current member of the Canadian Forces who has completed two tours in Afghanistan.

In March, Colin was part of the *Ironman 70.3* race in California consisting of a 1.2 mile swim, a 56-mile bike and a 13.1 mile run. He completed the race in 7:10:58 hours.

Colin has now collected \$220 from family and friends. In August, he will also run the *Ironman Canada* to take place in Penticton, B.C.; it is considered "the oldest and most loved triathlon race in the world".

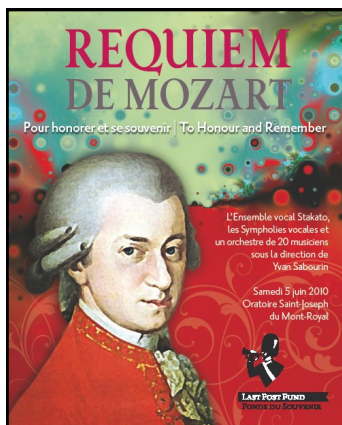

A REQUIEM TO HONOUR AND REMEMBER

On Saturday 5 June at 3 p.m., following the annual Last Post Fund commemorative ceremony at the Notre-Dame-des-Neiges and Mount-Royal cemeteries, a concert presentation will be held at Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount-Royal entitled *A Requiem to Honour and Remember*.



This concert is designed to honour the memory of all Veterans who lost their lives in the great wars of the 20th century and who now rest in the two Mount-Royal cemeteries where the Last Post Fund acquired its first lots 100 years ago. It also celebrates the commitment of Canadian Forces Veterans who have served our nation with honour and dignity, in wartime and in peacetime.

Mozart's *Requiem*, which he began composing at the end of his life, will be performed by two choirs and a full orchestra conducted by Yvan Sabourin. Veterans of the Royal Canadian Legion will highlight the concert presentation with a parade of flag-bearers. Tickets will

be on sale at the door the day of the concert.

On May 20, the Honourable Pierre Duchesne, Québec's 28th Lieutenant Governor and the Honorary Patron of the Last Post Fund (LPF) Québec Region, was invited to deliver the LPF Long Service Medal to employees and volunteer members of the LPF Québec Region.

Each of the recipients had completed a minimum of 12 years of exemplary service, "characterized by good conduct, industry and efficiency and that serves as a model for others". All together, these 17 civil, religious and military recipients have collected 292 years of exemplary service symbolizing their engagement to the Last Post Fund and to the community of Canadian and Allied Veterans, with particular attention to the less fortunate at the time of death. One of the recipients, Lieutenant General Gilles A. Turcot, for one, has completed 40 years of service to the Last Post Fund. The LPF Long Service Medal was created to mark the organization's centennial in 2009.
